# **Old Testament Reading:**

*Palm Sunday* Psalm 118: 1 – 2 & 19 – 29

<sup>1</sup>Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; His steadfast love endures for ever! <sup>2</sup> Let Israel say, "His steadfast love endures for ever." <sup>19</sup>Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the LORD. <sup>20</sup> This is the gate of the LORD; the righteous shall enter through it. <sup>21</sup> I thank You that You have answered me and have become my salvation. <sup>22</sup> The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. <sup>23</sup> This is the LORD's doing; it is marvellous in our eyes. <sup>24</sup> This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it! <sup>25</sup> Save us, we pray, O ORD! O LORD, we pray, give us success! <sup>26</sup> Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD!

We bless you from the house of the LORD.<sup>27</sup>The LORD is God and He has made His light to shine upon us. Bind the festal sacrifice with cords, up to the horns of the altar! <sup>28</sup>You are my God and I will give thanks to You; You are my God; I will extol You.<sup>29</sup>Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; His steadfast love endures for ever!

## New Testament Reading:

Mark 11: 1 – 6

<sup>1</sup>Now when they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of His disciples <sup>2</sup>and said to them, "Go into the village in front of you and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied; on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it. <sup>3</sup>If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately.'" <sup>4</sup>And they went away and found a colt tied at a door outside in the street and they untied it. <sup>5</sup>And some of those standing there said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" <sup>6</sup>They told them what Jesus had said and they let them go.

# **Gospel Reading:**

## John 12: 12 – 18

<sup>12</sup> The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. <sup>13</sup> So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" <sup>14</sup> And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, <sup>15</sup> "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" <sup>16</sup> His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about Him and had been done to Him. <sup>17</sup> The crowd that had been with Him when He called Lazarus

out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. <sup>18</sup> The reason why the crowd went to meet Him was that they heard He had done this sign.
