Palm Sunday

## **Old Testament Reading:**

**Zechariah 9: 9 – 10** 

<sup>9</sup>Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is He, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. <sup>10</sup>I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off and He shall speak peace to the nations; His rule shall be from sea to sea and from the River to the ends of the earth.

## **Second Reading:** Psalm 118: 1-2 & 19 – 29

<sup>1</sup>Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; for His steadfast love endures for ever! <sup>2</sup>Let Israel say, "His steadfast love endures for ever." ... <sup>19</sup> Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the LORD. <sup>20</sup> This is the gate of the LORD; the righteous shall enter through it. <sup>21</sup> I thank You that You have answered me and have become my salvation. <sup>22</sup> The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. <sup>23</sup> This is the LORD's doing; it is marvellous in our eyes. <sup>24</sup> This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. <sup>5</sup> Save us, we pray, O LORD! O LORD, we pray, give us success! <sup>26</sup> Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD! We bless you from the house of the LORD. <sup>27</sup> The LORD is God and He has made His light to shine upon us. Bind the festal sacrifice with cords, up to the horns of the altar! <sup>28</sup> You are my God and I will give thanks to You; You are my God; I will extol You. <sup>29</sup> Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; His steadfast love endures for ever!

## Gospel Reading: Luke 19: 28 – 40

<sup>28</sup>when [Jesus] had said these things, He went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. <sup>29</sup>When He drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, He sent two of the disciples, 30 saying, "Go into the village in front of you, where on entering you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat. Untie it and bring it here. 31If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' you shall say this: 'The Lord has need of it." 32So those who were sent went away and found it just as He had told them. 33And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying the colt?" 34And they said, "The Lord has need of it." <sup>35</sup>And they brought it to lesus and throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set lesus on it. <sup>36</sup>And as he rode along, they spread their cloaks on the road. <sup>37</sup>As He was drawing near —already on the way down the Mount of Olives — the whole multitude of His disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen, <sup>38</sup>saying, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" <sup>39</sup>And some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples." 40 He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out."

True and humble king, hailed by the crowd as Messiah: grant us the faith to know You and love You, that we may be found beside You on the way of the cross, which is the path of glory.
